IMPORTANCE OF THE BREASTPLATE

The breastplate was of great importance because by means of it, in days of old, God revealed his Divine will to His chosen people. It was designed by God Himself and the directions as to how it was to be made were given to Moses. (Exodus xxviii. 15, 20). The

breastplate was clearly designed with the idea that the names of the twelve tribes engraved on the stones should be brought before God "as a continual memorial," and that Aaron should "bear them upon his heart, when he went into the most holy place." (Exodus xxviii. 12, 29). When in use the breastplate was suspended from the shoulders by means of two gold chains, hung from gold rings fastened on the shoulder straps, the lower ends being fastened to the two gold rings on the uppermost corners of the breastplate. On the two lower corners were also gold rings, through which 'a lace of blue' was passed to fasten it securely to the ephod.
